A lot has happened over the last 3 months. This edition provides an excellent overview of group activities during that time at CACA.

In November, the Christmas Fair was held. The event was successful in two ways. From a financial viewpoint, the Fair raised funds to aid us financially and the result met our expectation. More importantly, there was a lot of interaction between the various group members as we worked together during the Fair. It also provides an opportunity to admire the variety of creativity of members. A gigantic *thank you* must go to the Fair Convenor as well as all the people who contributed and worked at the Fair. I am sure a lot of people may not understand how much work is required to make an event like this happen and to be the success it was.

As an update to the matters we discussed in the September edition:

- As reported last time, the master development plan submitted to the Sunshine Coast Council was approved, resulting in the Council formally agreeing to a development plan for the Centre. As an adjunct to this, in early December, the Council will now be formally considering our application for a long-term lease. Once we are aware of the outcome of our application, we will provide an update to you.

As our groups begin to wind down and we enter the Christmas and New Year period, the Centre itself will become quiet. However North Street Made (NSM) remains open. Please do not forget NSM, especially for the gifts we love to share with our friends and families. Also a special thank you for those members who will work at NSM over this holiday period.

In closing, on behalf of the management committee and myself, we wish you all a very safe and happy Christmas and a wonderful 2025.

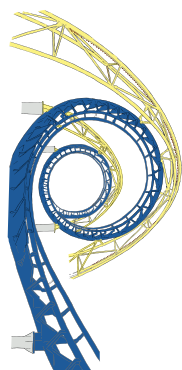
Textile and Fibre Art

Beads and Bling

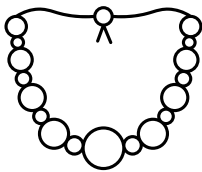
We've had a busy few months at Beads 'n Bling. Quite a few big donations of beads have come in so we have been making things for the Fair and for various local charities.

Aspects of Art

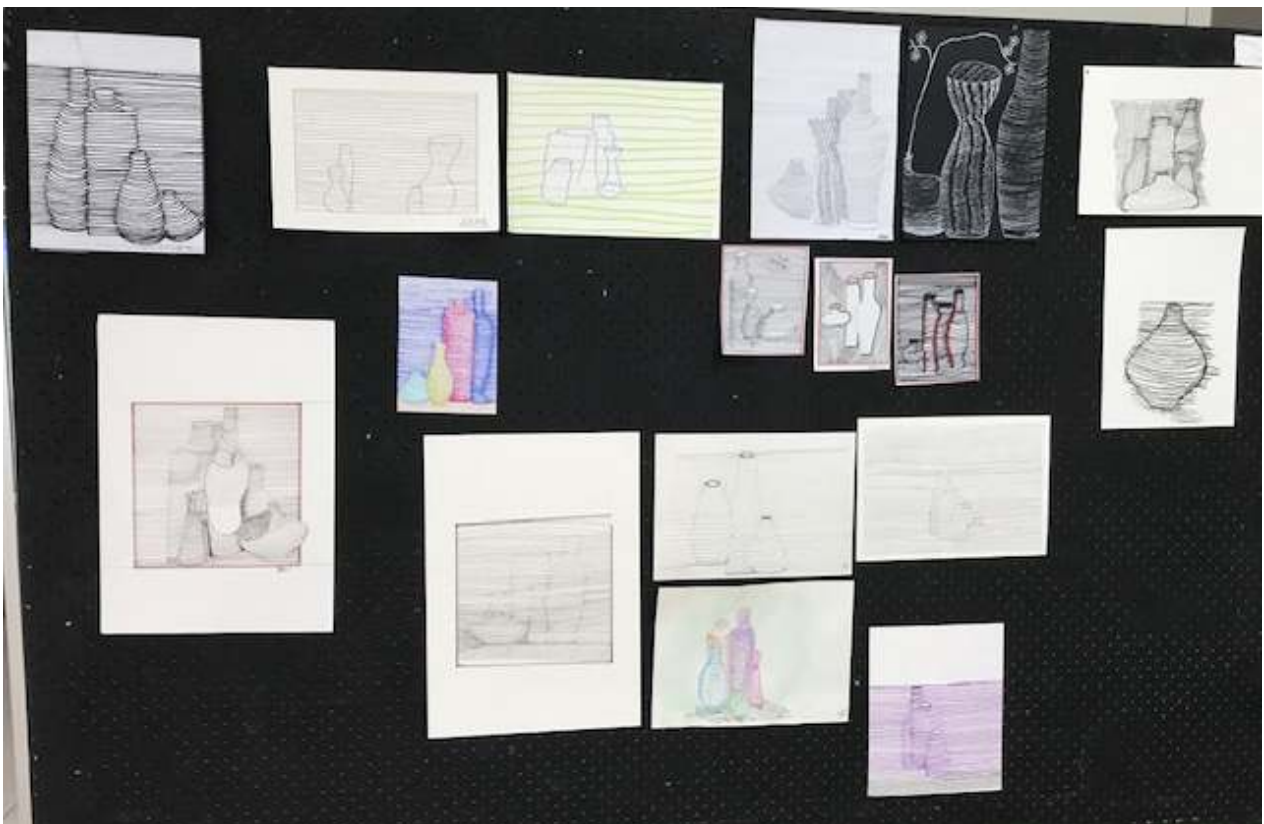

As we are all at different levels of artistic competence. We find it fun to help and inspire each other. We frequently surprise ourselves and the group by producing an art work of which we are proud.

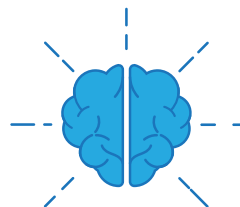

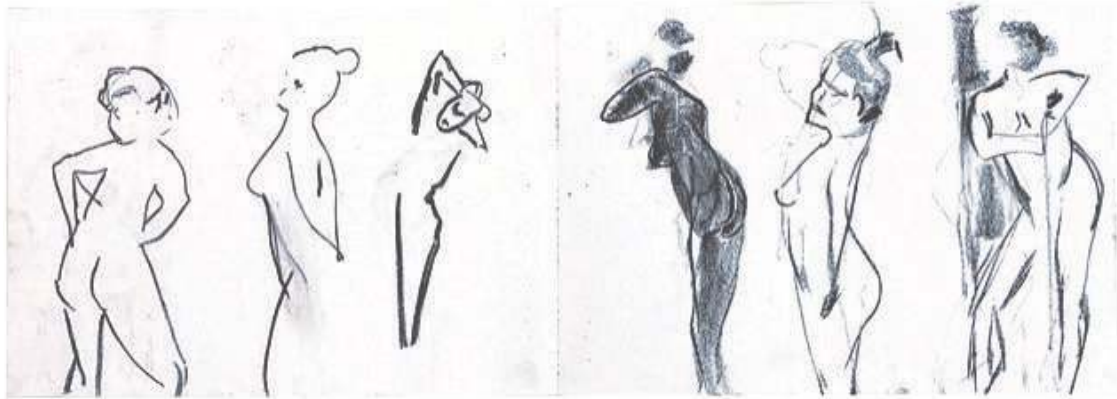




Expressive Art

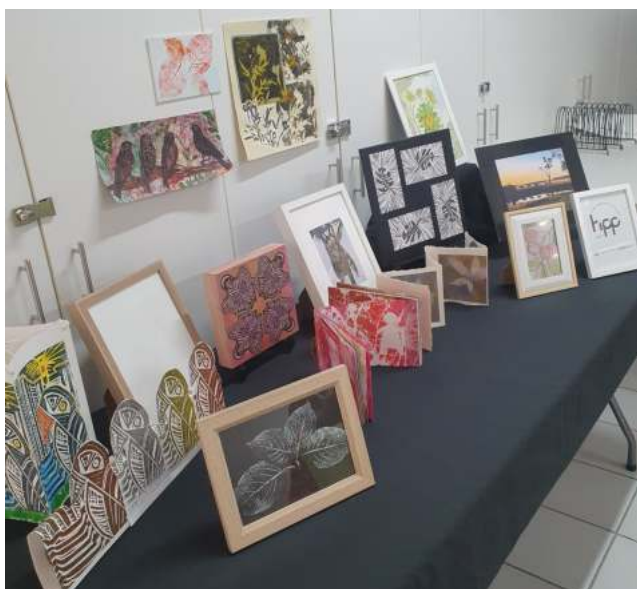

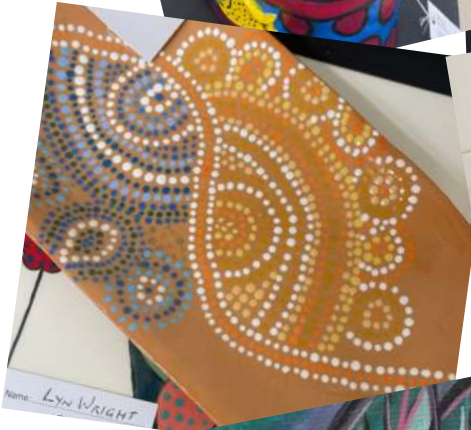

HAPPY YARNERS here again.

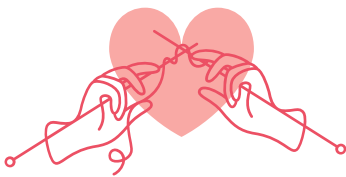
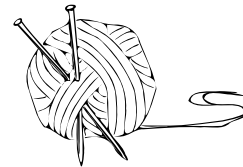
Well, what a year! 2 fabulous Fairs, a great Open Weekend not forgetting our new President. Mike has jumped in with both feet hitting the ground running.

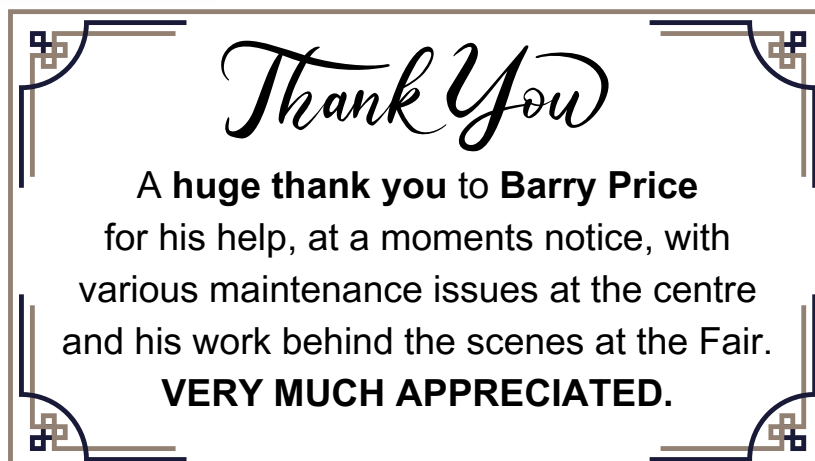
