# President's Report

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Hello to everyone and I hope and trust you had a very enjoyable and safe Xmas and New Year.

We are now into the 2025 year in full swing. The last couple of months has been very interesting for the Caloundra Arts Centre Association (CACA). Before I go and provide a helicopter view of what has happened within CACA, I must refer you to the following articles which provide a very good overview of the happenings within the groups. Great efforts.

One thing that has become very obvious in 2024, is that a lot of members in their group(s), are not aware of what other groups do. I really suggest you research other groups and commence communication between groups.

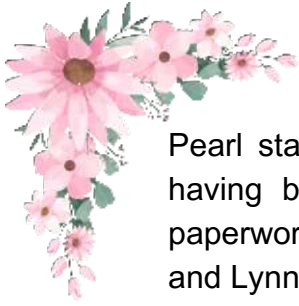
In the later part of 2024, the Sunshine Coast Council itself considered the recommendation of its Property Management Group in relation to our current lease. We have, on receipt of approval of the development plan (Masterplan), followed up on the provision of a lease for a further 30 years (the current lease is due to expire in December 2025). The recommendation to Council, which was approved, was a provision of a further 2 years lease with the proviso that if funding for the redevelopment was approved and obtained within 2 year (2027), then the lease would then revert to a 30 year lease.

This was good and bad news. Good news was that Council had extended our current lease to 2027; on the flip side, we have now, two years to obtain development funding. If not obtained, we will revert to a normal type lease, if Council approves.

In January 2025 Notice of AGM Meeting and election of Office Bearers was issued to members. As a follow up to this considerable time and energy was expended trying to find a replacement Secretary (our current secretary then, Maureen Markwell, had served a 3 year term, and therefore had to stand down and was not able to stand for re-election). A replacement / new Secretary was not found at the AGM, and as at present date, the position is still vacant. The major issue with this, is that if a secretary position is not filled, the Centre will be forced to close down, as under the differing regulations under we, as a Registered Charity and Association operate, we must have a Secretary. A call for help was issued to all members, but no applications have been received. We will provide further information as we progress to the time limit we have to address this extremely urgent matter.

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## *Celebrating 40 Years*

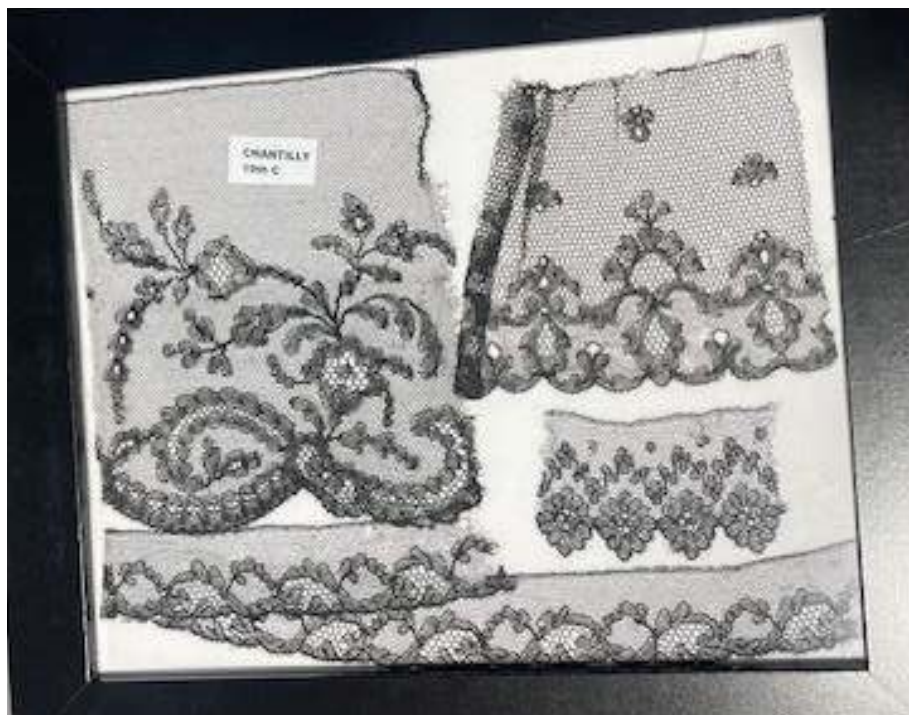
Lacemakers celebrate 40 years this year having formed within the Stitchers Group in 1975. Irene Sephton wrote in 1995 *"in 1975 three of us Norma O'Keefe, Isabel Scott and myself formed Lacemakers"*. Starting with 3 members we now have 16 members in 2025.

Many of the group during this time have also been members of the Australian Lace Guild Queensland Division hosting many of their meetings at CACA over the years. It is amazing to think that a creative art form, having its beginnings in the 16th Century, is now still flourishing at CACA.

This year also marks 50 years since the United Nations Proclaimed 1975 as the International Women's Year. The United Nations World Conference was held in Mexico City in mid 1975 with Australia represented by Elizabeth Reid AO, FASSA (who provided advice to the Prime Minister and Cabinet assessing submissions for their impact on women) and Margaret Whitlam AO (social campaigner, author and athlete).

In recognition of this significant event the Lacemakers are creating a tribute to women to go on display in the foyer in time for Caloundra Zonta Group (who work towards the empowerment of women and girls) visit in November, as CACA hosts their middle school Art Show 'Envisioning a World Without Violence'. # Spinning and Weaving

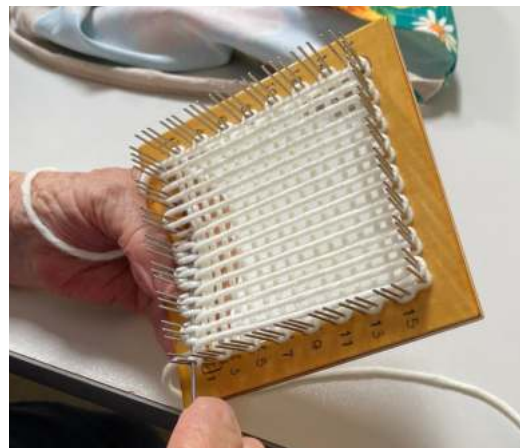

# Expressive Art

Expressive Art members invited the artist Adrienne Williams from Bundaberg to take a Saturday workshop on 30th November 2024.

Adrienne works mainly in oils but she adapted her technique of working in sgraffito on board to working with acrylics on board for our workshop. Expressive art members work mainly in acrylic.

Sgraffito is the art of scratching into wet paint to reveal the colours of an underlying layer of pre-dried paint to create patterns and/or designs. Sgraffito is an older, pre-acrylics technique. Because acrylic paints dry very quickly they are not designed with sgraffito in mind. For this reason we used drying retarder in order to lengthen the drying time of the overlying paint layer. This was not always successful in the short time of the workshop and would need a lot of practice with the drying retarder to achieve a satisfactory result.

All members prepared for the workshop by buying painting boards rather than canvas. Painting boards are firm and make it easier to scratch into the paint, instead of prepared canvas which is inclined to give.

As we only had one day to complete a painting we worked quickly from still life with either objects or/and flora.

1. Gelli-plate print using complimentary colours.
2. Lino block print use a monochrome colour scheme.
3. Colograph print using a "cool" or "warm" colour palette
4. Scan'n'cut design using favourite colour scheme.

We are also planning workshop days through the year. Looking forward to our A.G.M. meeting at the end of February to appoint leadership positions for the 2025 and participating in C.A.C.A. events with our usual enthusiasm. From H.P.P. till next time....

Last year, our theory focus was on colour and loosening up our approach to practical work. In October, we had a successful exhibition of our work in the Sturgess display cabinet again, and faithful to our supportive, non-competitive ethos, everyone was equally encouraged to participate irrespective of where they were in their art practice journey. A highlight for us was our workshop with artist and teacher Jenni Kelly, who helped us discover exciting, creative things we had never thought of before - talk about inspired! We also enjoyed an *en plein air* excursion to Diamond Head to draw/paint trees, boats and houses while having a picnic morning tea together or as in the case of one, a snooze, or perhaps they were just quietly reflecting with eyes closed on a collapsible camp chair. We finished the year with another great Christmas Party/lunch at the Parklands Tavern.

With our teaching/learning ethos continuing into 2025, our focus this year will be mainly on Perspective for theory, and Mixed Media for our practical work, while not losing sight of the importance of drawing and understanding the Elements of Art and Principles of Design. We began by exploring 19th Century Impressionism to understand why/how it emerged in the evolution of Western art and completed a Monet Waterlily styled “Impressionist” exercise. This will be followed shortly, with a couple of classes on artist’s materials, what they are and how to use them creatively. We plan to have another, maybe two, *en plein air* picnics and paint excursions somewhere. We have also pencilled in exploring Contemporary Art, what it is, and how to do and understand it before visiting the Caloundra Regional Gallery to enjoy and critical review the two 2025 Art prize exhibitions. We are also looking to have another visiting artist/teacher workshop sometime. Then, who knows!

So it’s a busy and exciting year ahead and we wish all other CACA Groups a happy and creatively successful 2025 too.

# Mother's Day Fair

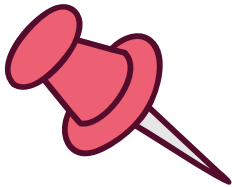

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372 RED CROSS Trauma Teddies were forwarded to The Red Cross as well as baby blankets for premature birth were passed on to Wish List by Edna Adderson.

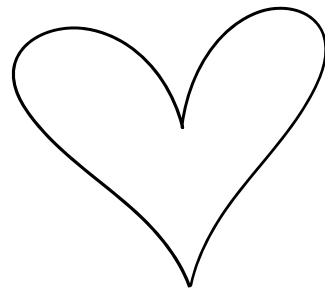

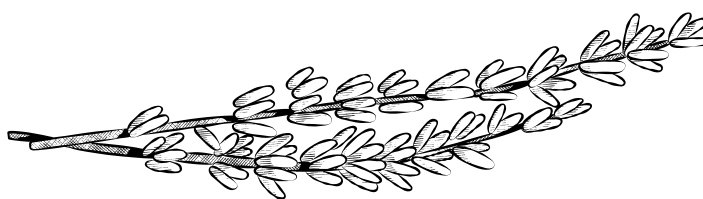
