President's Report

Hello to everyone and I hope you are well.

I will keep my update brief, as I am trying to get round to groups and provide a brief overview of what has been happening in the life of the centre. Within this edition, the groups have provided a very good overview of what has happened within their own area.

More pertinent matters to bring to your attention:

- Our lease of the CACA site on which we operate is due to expire in December 2025. We are currently working with Council to be granted a 10 year lease, together with having legal advice provided to us in their review of the draft document.
- We have previously conducted internal workshops to identify what we consider are the major challenges we see are facing CACA going into the future. The need to increase our membership base and the offerings made available to current and new members, is seen as a major matter for consideration.
- We have utilised an external body to help us understand what new members and members of different age groups require of the Centre, make maximum use of our available space and direct a marketing plan. A major item appears to be that we develop new workshops and offerings to accommodate people such as working mothers to attend classes say after hours which ties in with their working hours and family requirements.
- Internally we are proposing to conduct a review of the operations of North Street Made (NSM) to determine how we can improve the results of the shop to warrant the major efforts of so many members. An interesting observation is that the varying groups who attend different classes are not often visitors and customers to the NSM shop.
- Recently we received a partial grant from Sunshine Coast Council to upgrade the Centre's Electrical Power Board. The power board, being identified in Council's maintenance report as a safety concern, will also maximise available power to the Centre to hopefully enable an additional pottery kiln to be installed.

I encourage you to read all of the articles in Art-I-Facts as you will then obtain an overview of the large efforts occurring throughout the Centre by many of our members.

I will mention three examples of very successful events members have provided throughout the last quarter, which all should be extremely proud of, being:

- Mothers Day Artisan Fair
- The Quilt Show
- The concert provided by the CacaPhonics Group.

REMEMBERING OUR REMARKABLE JOAN CRANE.

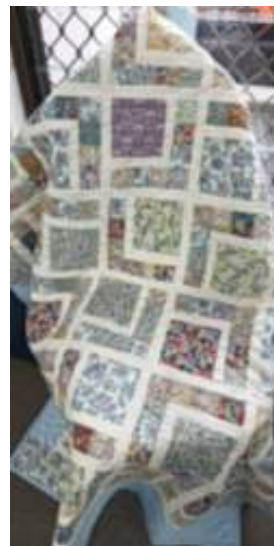
Foundation member of Caloundra Quilters (1986) and Life Member since 2003. Joan was a tireless worker for our group in many capacities - the last role she held for many years being Bus Trip Coordinator. She had a strong grasp of math and spent many years recording and tallying members' sales sheets for each Fair as well as enlisting Quilters to handle the receiving of each CACA member's goods for sale. Joan worked assiduously for The Gallery (now NSM), helping make it the success it has become.

Her expanding family received her gifts of quilts, all individually made, with each recipient in mind. One of her greatest loves was "Alice in Wonderland" and her quilt of the same name and of which she was very proud, is beautiful, especially considering her failing eyesight. At our recent quilt show there was much interest in her "Southern Aurora" Quilt inspired by her trip to Alaska.

Her loves outside quilting were many. Apart from her family these were many and included War Widows, Legacy, and Jim Beam Clubs. As with quilters she held various executive positions with these groups, still being Treasurer for War Widows and Jim Beam Clubs at the time of her passing. Joan was an avid traveller at home and overseas, even having a trip booked on the 11th of August for a 5-day Mystery Trip.

Joan died on the 6th of August, surrounded by all the love of her family just as she had extended her love to them during her lifetime. She was a wonderful friend and great contributor to every group fortunate enough to call her a member. Joan died 4 months short of her 100th Birthday having lived a very full, and interesting life.

We love you Joan and will miss you dearly.

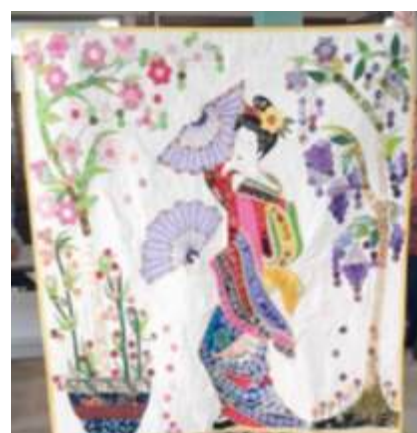

Aspects of Art

It is 12 months since our wonderful facilitator and mentor, Margi Parry, finished taking our group. Margi dropped by last week to see how we were going.

Patti Kronk and myself have been coming up with little challenges every session. Our experienced artist, Bev Black has given us a few lessons in painting negative spaces using watercolours where we paint over the top of the undercoat.....quite a challenge but we thoroughly enjoyed the fun. We are pleased we have attracted quite a few new members this year. Our group is called Aspects of Art because of all the many aspects we explore lately our challenges have been:

- collage
- drawing with a stick with indian ink on wet watercolour paper
- finger painting(NB. the People's Choice Award at this year's Archibald Prize was a finger painting)
- drawing seed pods with white on black paper
- mandalas
- Painting leaves by using only tiny dots.

We are a friendly, relaxed group and we DO NOT compete. At the end of each session all work is displayed and comments from the artist and other members are encouraged. What is delightful is we frequently discover that a certain technique really really suits one of us so they can go deeper into that technique.

Our main strength is our ability levels range from raw beginners to experienced artists who have sold many works. We all inspire and help each other.

Pottery

Greetings one and all,

Winter is almost over. It will be lovely to welcome the warmth of Spring and all that comes with a new season, new growth sprouting and hopefully new creative inspiration for pottery. During the cooler months we really notice how long it takes for our pottery to cure. It's always about the creative journey, the process in bringing forth a one-off piece for all of us to enjoy.

We welcome three new members. Nathan, Giselle and Diana will join our group in August. Jan will take them through a basic training course which will highlight safety issues, the correct use of equipment and general potting information.

Once again a kiln maintenance crew devoted a couple of hard- working days on a weekend in July to grind down the shelves, paint them with wash and dry them. This process is contingent to maintaining the shelves for the smooth running of the kilns.

The glaze-making team do a great job to keep us well stocked with our favourite glazes. Being that the manufacture of glazes is a science, we are grateful for those who produce and develop a wide range of colourful glazes. Julia continues to trial new mixes which some of us experiment with. Some potters use commercially made glazes which have produced some really beautiful works.

Recently, Jan held a slip workshop instructing the group how to use stencils, layering and the use of a slip trail. It was well attended and they found it most helpful.

Vicki lead a small animal sculpture class where she taught how to assemble and refine a sculpture. unique creatures have been built and we look forward to seeing the finished sculptures.

The CACA committee has given the OK to extend the hours of the facility. Hopefully these times (6.00-9.00 pm on Tuesday nights), will inspire people to make use of the place outside business hours. Usual fees will apply.

Following an approval by the CACA committee, we have begun to build a bird bath which will be situated in the gardens of the CACA premises. This sculpture will be constructed in acknowledgement of 50 years of Caloundra Potters. Helen has used buff raku clay and is off to a great start. This shared project will be decorated with individually hand-hewn items made by members.

Last Tuesday, we gathered for morning tea, for "Plate Day", when we number our plate, draw a numbered ticket and receive a new plate. 39 plates were re-homed.

As Joan and Bronnie step away from their involvement with Caloundra Potters, we took the opportunity at the morning tea to honour them for their long standing valued contribution to our group. They received flowers and gifts and a beautiful clay dedication plaque was presented to them. This plaque was made by Jan. Susan and Vicki shared stories of their mutual potting experiences.

Over many long years, Joan and Bronnie have fulfilled differing roles, Joan officiating as President of CACA as well as taking on the responsibility as Group Leader. Bronnie took an active role on the firing team and was a great source of information about the many aspects of pottery. During their time with us, both have generously shared their knowledge, technical skills, time and effort for which many of us are grateful.

Joan has kindly donated to the group many of her pottery tools. Recently Brian installed her extruder. It expels coils of clay in a range of differing sizes and shapes. It's great for hand building items and has been in popular use since the initial installation. Many thanks Joan.

We have had a series of discussions recently regarding the ongoing care of the facility, future funds for equipment and the financials of Caloundra Potters. A small group of members were appointed to collect data and report back to the group with their findings. Thank you to those who spent time in discussions and to those who researched and prepared the detailed report. It was a very useful process.

Mike McDonald, the president of CACA, spoke to us last week about the ongoing implications for CACA and its relationship to the Community. Ideas were exchanged about fund-raising and how to bring more community awareness to the North Street Made shop and all that CACA has to offer.

At the moment, we are preparing for the next Christmas Fair which will be held on the weekend of the 8th and 9th of November. All members are encouraged to exhibit their work. A percentage of these sales goes directly to CACA, as does our work which is sold in the gallery.

The girls at Machinery Embroidery celebrated their birthday last month and had a beautiful lunch with everyone getting a present and a fat quarter. They also did a project called making your own fabric. They will now use their piece they have made and make it into something to sell at the Christmas Fair in November.

Hi everyone,

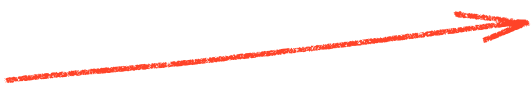

Stitchers

Stitchers meets every Wednesday morning 9am-12noon. Our members undertake a variety of 'stitchy' projects such as knitting, crochet, embroidery, sashiko, cross-stitch, as well as enjoying each other's company.

Early July Quilters had a two-day workshop on Wednesday & Thursday using our meeting areas, so we had an excursion to the Power Boat club. We had a delightful time, still creating items as well as devouring the yummy scones, jam & cream.

The first Wednesday of each month Rosemary is conducting a 'learn to crochet granny squares' workshop. Who knew there were so many different sorts of granny squares! Everyone's crochet is improving and eventually they will learn to join all the squares to make a lovely rug.



Hard Pressed Printers

The winter season has seen Wednesday afternoons filled with activity, with members exploring a variety of printing methods including our second challenge for the year: A linocut block design printed in a monochrome colour scheme.

Linocut involves the transfer of a design onto vinyl or linoleum - a soft synthetic material commonly used for floor covering - it is a relief printmaking method in which areas that will not be seen are cut away. It is one of the most traditional forms of printing. Many thoughtful responses from members produced innovative and striking artworks for display. Using only one colour and its tones and tints added to the challenge.

The Collagraph has also featured during the winter season following our workshop with this method last Autumn. Many members are new to the variety and techniques of Collagraph printing so the roller press was literally "running hot" exploring ideas. As our third challenge was also a Collagraph design using a warm or cool colour scheme, pursuing the perfect print has occupied many printing sessions. The high quality of results showed members increased knowledge and skill using this form of printing.

Many members attend workshops or art exhibitions outside C.A.C.A. so "show and tell" is an important part of H.P.P. afternoons. We have viewed and discussed vibrant hand printed fabrics, ecoprints on card, tetrapak and collagraph prints as well as interesting catalogues from art exhibitions and informative chats and examples of anything new in printmaking products. Thankyou to members who contributed to "show and tell" during the winter season, helping to expand our knowledge of the craft of printmaking.

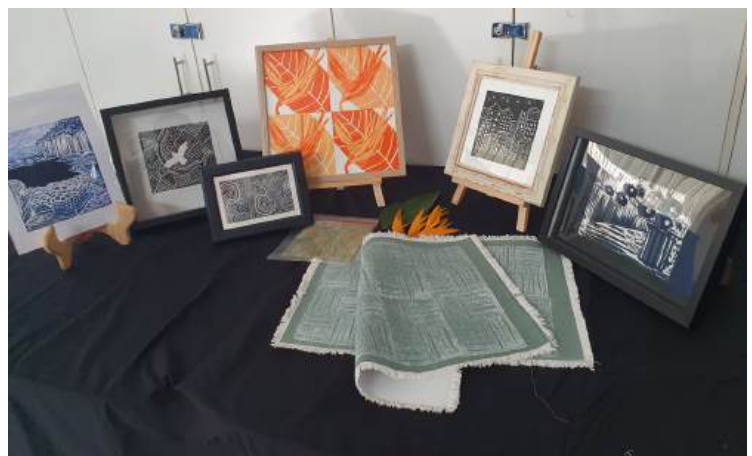
There were many participants in the Gelli-print workshop despite the lack of power. Lamplight and pulled back curtains provided enough illumination for the workshop to go ahead. Gelli-plate printing is always popular as the results can be used in so many ways eg: card making, 3D objects and collage and what better to do while watching prints dry than eat a delicious strawberry dessert cake made by our expert baker and team leader Lin Smith. Congratulations also to H.P.P. members who had printed artworks assessed and accepted for sale. Showcasing fine examples of the unique art of printmaking and adding to the range of merchandise sold at North Street Made.

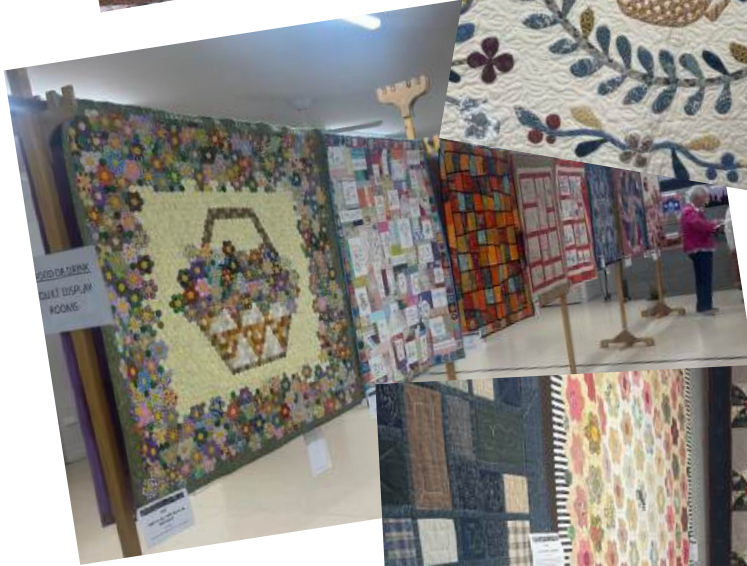

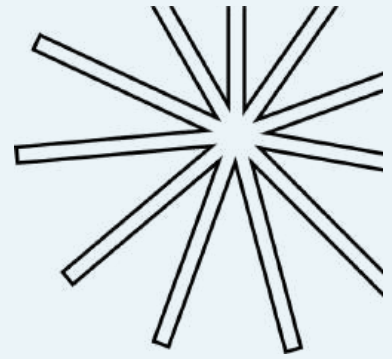
